Questions..... and answers

We asked for questions and we have had lots that we have answered in this and our earlier newsletters. Please keep your questions coming... and your feedback... so we can keep the newsletter relevant.

Play: Timings, movements etc

We like to keep things simple and consistent across all our tournaments. What does that mean?

Our informal soundings of members showed that most of you want to play 18-21 boards. We also know that everyone would prefer playing with robots rather than having a sit out...so we do.

Everyone wants a time limit for each board/round so we have adopted a 'goldilocks' time of 8 minutes per board or better. Many tournaments run at faster than this...driven by the speed of play of the players that day, not the system.

We also believe that everyone is happier playing each other pair rather than pairs sitting either N/S or E/W. So we always use a Howell movement and this element is pre-programmed into all our tournaments along with board timings.

So after everyone has registered 15 minutes before each tournament starts, the director makes the final adjustments to the tournament. The director sets how many rounds and boards per round based on how many pairs/tables within the 18-21 board range. So, for example, if we have 8 pairs that means 7 rounds so every pair plays all the other pairs, hence 3 boards per round and a total of 21 boards.

Why watch the clock?

We usually have a standard message at the start of each tournament about keeping and eye on the clock....but why?

The tournament clock runs in the top left hand corner of your screen and shows how much time is left to play in that round. Our boards are set up to run at a rate of 8-minutes per board (unless there are technical challenges, for example with loss of the internet or a powercut, when the director may adjust the time).

If you run out of time then the system will then give you an adjusted score. Will it be fair? Yes. Will you feel happy? Maybe. Truthfully, you are unlikely to persuade the director to make an manual adjustment to over-ride the automatic adjustment. Our best advice is watch the clock.
