We need to expand the number of Directors; Steve Simmons is joining the Committee, and has been trained as a scorer, and is training as a TD, funded by the Club. David Waide is also training, funded by Ridgeway, but available as an extra TD. Ian McAlroy is joining the Committee, and will take over responsibility as Membership Secretary from John Dowbiggin.

David Waide proposed a vote of thanks, and a gift of wine to Mike Vetch for his work as Chairman.

Appendix 1: Treasurer's Report for 2021

We have had a positive financial year with a £1347 operating surplus plus £134 deposit account interest, totalling an increase of £1481. The club now has total assets of £18,373, comprising £15,666 on deposit and the rest in our current account and owed as interest.

Going into a little detail: on-line bridge made a surplus of £1250, Tuesday afternoon F2F made a contribution of £31, and Wednesday evening made a loss of £93. Tables per session averaged 4 for the Virtual Club, 6 on Tuesday afternoon and 5 on Wednesday evening.

Comparing with 2020 half the differences are due to different numbers of on-line and F2F sessions.

Other differences are:

- 2021 had a subs holiday for existing members, there were reduced prize costs in 2021 as fewer prize competitions were run;
- 2020 funded hand driers for the Royal British Legion,
- and 2021 had teaching income of £410, thanks to Mike Vetch and helpers.
- We also contributed to raising £1700 for Children in Need together with four other Worcestershire clubs.

The change to cashless operation has gone fairly smoothly. There has been some confusion and extra work due to a small amount of under- and over-payment. I will continue to explore ways of simplifying the billing process to make it clearer for everyone.

Looking ahead the Club continues to be financially sound with significant assets.

I have recommended to the committee that we carry out a strategic financial review on the purpose for holding significant assets and what we might do with them.
