Bridge is played regularly at U3A groups across the county, there are teachers and coaches to help you get started and to improve your game, please look up your local group for more information.

Gentle Bridge: We are running sessions of "gentle bridge" (try-duplicate) at several venues across Worcestershire. These are for players who have been taking lessons, either beginners' course, or a further course and want to continue to improve their bidding and play. The sessions, usually, but not always, run alongside an established bridge club session. Gentle Bridge players play the same boards as the experienced bridge players, but fewer boards are played, so the pace of play is slower. Gradually the speed of play increases, and if the players want, they can transition into the main bridge club and enjoy playing there. The sessions are fun, informative, and sociable.
