The winning team qualifies for the Inter-County Pachabo Cup and our County's team finished fourth out of twenty-nine teams this year.

In the County League competition, matches are generally played in team members' houses and the atmosphere is always very sociable. There are three open divisions in the league and teams are promoted and relegated each season. In addition there is a "No-Fear" division and we are expecting that, as more newcomers get into the game as a result of the County's programme of education and as former players return, there will be an additional No-Fear division this year.
