Extend Your ACOL

Teacher: John Guest
Start date: 10:00 – 12:00, Wednesday 7th January
Cost: £8 per session (pay as you attend)

These lessons are suitable for players who have done the “Revise your ACOL” in the autumn or are established club players who wish to add specific conventions to their understandings. They cost £8 per lesson and you are only charged for the ones you attend.

There is no need to register and you don’t need a partner. It is OK to come to just the topics that interest you.

Before each lesson you will receive a straightforward handout, containing the essentials of the topic. The lesson starts with a brief introduction, then 4 boards where everyone plays the same and we can discuss them a little. Continuing Bridge [Green Book]: Part 2/3

Start date: 10:00 – 12:15, Monday 19th January and repeated: 19:00 – 21:15, Wednesday 21st January
Cost: £8 per session (pay as you attend)

This is a continuation course for beginners who have done 30 lessons of Beginners Bridge Book 1 (The Red Book). Split into 3 parts over the year, it consists of 30 lessons based on Continuing Bridge Book 2 (The Green Book). The same lesson is delivered twice each week – on Mondays and Wednesdays – to allow for maximum flexibility of attendance.

TADSS (Think And Do Something Sensible)

an intensive 'analysis-in-the-wild' session addressing all aspects of duplicate play

Teachers Andrew Merrison & The TADSS Team

Dates: 10:00 – 12:00, Tuesdays

Cost: £8 per session (pay as you attend)

Using selected hands from the previous evening's "Improvers 7-High" session, students will bid, play and discuss multiple aspects of 4 deals, with a tutor at the table acting as a Socratic guide – constantly encouraging them to: Think And Do Something Sensible. Wherever possible, hands are chosen to potentially allow for each participant to be declarer.

After 4 boards and a coffee break, the tutors move on to a different table and the process is repeated, thereby allowing students to experience two styles of tutelage per session.

Tutors are armed with the relevant travellers from the previous evening's play so that results can be compared. (And of course, if they can remember their own bidding and play, anyone who has already played the hands the previous evening should gain additional insights!)

NB:

The nature of organising tutors means that we will always be able to guarantee accommodating 3 tables (12 students)

We should be able to accommodate 4 tables (16) students and occasionally we may be able to accommodate a 5th table.

BUT. In the unlikely event that too many people show up, there will be overspill capacity in the other room at 'Assisted Play'.

Defence

Teachers: Andrew Merrison & James Carpenter
Start date: 10:00 – 12:00, Thursday 22nd January
Cost: £8 per session (pay as you attend)

“Without a doubt, defence is the hardest part of bridge. Every average player knows the principles of bidding and sensible ways to play as declarer [TADSS!], but when it comes to defence, players make mistake after mistake. This is often the result of insufficient information to make the right choice.” (*Wladyslaw Izdebski & Roman Krzemien*)

Given that you will spend roughly 25% of your time at the table as declarer, but 50% as a defender, it really pays to invest in acquiring good defensive habits and skills in order to markedly improve your scores (and enjoyment). This course is therefore designed for all bridge players who want to develop and improve their defensive technique.

The topics are:

Feb 5th	Defence vs No Trump – the lead
Feb 12th	3rd hand play – using what you think Partner holds
Feb 19th	Signalling in No Trump – what to signal and how
Feb 26th	Defence vs suit contracts – the lead
Mar 5th	2nd hand play – be a clever ducker
Mar 12th	Signalling in Suit Contracts
Mar 19th	Suit preference signals
Mar 26th	Passive or Active ...?

Assisted Play

These sessions are designed for learners, both new and old, to practise their bidding, play and defence with assistance.

You can refer to your crib sheets, ask advice and have a discussion.

In some instances you may be introduced to some common conventions which have not been covered in your beginners' lessons.

The group consists of players at different levels of learning but help is always at hand and you have a relaxed and friendly atmosphere to practise your bridge.

YOUTH ACADEMY (free for children)

Resuming in September 2025 on Wednesdays, 16:30 – 18:30 (dates will be posted on the club website).

York Bridge Club Youth Academy meets on Wednesdays to provide an opportunity for young people to learn and play bridge together

- Current members are aged between 8 and 16 although National Youth Bridge includes players up to the age of 25
- The sessions are free and include a break with refreshments
- All our teachers hold a current DBS and child safeguarding qualifications
- Bridge is taught through live play and students are encouraged to learn by problem solving
- Students begin by playing Minibridge and progress to learning basic ACOL
- A new technique is introduced each session and handouts guide students through the bidding and play
- Students also work towards the EBED Junior Awards and The Nora Penn Award

AND FOR THOSE WHO ARE COMPETITIVE AND LIKE OR WANT TO TRY DUPLICATE BRIDGE, THERE IS:

First Step Duplicate (May to October)

(no partner required, just turn up) on the **FIRST SATURDAY of the month (13:00 – 16:15)**

This session is aimed at those who are very new to duplicate bridge.

The format allows players time to ask for advice from teachers as well as to discuss and ask questions between boards.

Crib sheets and system notes are perfectly acceptable.

Normal session prices: £5.25 for members and £6.25 for visitors

Gentle Duplicate (no partner required, just turn up) on **Friday mornings (10:00 – 13:15)**

This session is aimed at those who have less experience or who are new to duplicate bridge.

The format allows players time to discuss boards and ask questions *between* sets of boards.

Only simple systems are allowed so that all are 'singing from the same hymn sheet'.

The session is run as a match-pointed duplicate session and results are uploaded to the EBU and club website.

Normal session prices: £5.25 for members and £6.25 for visitors

Improvers' Duplicate (7-High) (partner required) on **Monday evenings (19:00 – 22:00)**

This is an opportunity for less experienced players to come along on a Monday evening and play (usually around 22 boards) in a relaxed environment, open to those who have recently or not so recently completed a beginners course.

Currently, pairs are usually expected to have a combined NGS of no greater than 16 (though this at the discretion of the TD).
